



2024 UCI BMX World Cup - Rider Entry Information

All riders are advised to carefully read and understand all the information below.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible to enter BMX World Cups you MUST:

- Meet the requirements outlined in the BMXNZ Ride Level Assessment document. <u>Click here to view the requirements</u>. All New Zealand rider entries will be subject to confirmation from BMXNZ that these requirements have been met.
- UCI Licence Requirements:

For racing outside of New Zealand:

Riders must hold a current UCI International Race Licence with the nationality marked as NZL. Your insurance (required for your International Race Licence to be processed) must cover the duration of the international events for which you are applying.

For racing within New Zealand (Rotorua):

Riders must hold (at a minimum) a <u>Cycling New Zealand UCI Domestic Race Licence</u>. BMXNZ Licences will not be accepted.

Cycling New Zealand will:

- Complete entries for UCI World Cups.
- Forward on any UCI / CNZ communications.
- Please note there will be no specific Team Manager / Cycling New Zealand staff for New Zealand at the World Cup or UEC Round events.

Note: Any fines received by the rider are the responsibility of the rider to pay (The UCI sends any fines through Cycling New Zealand who will on-invoice for the rider to pay).

ANTI-DOPING

We encourage all riders competing overseas to complete education through Drug Free Sport NZ (DFSNZ). If you have not completed any DFSNZ education in the current calendar year please complete the <u>DFSNZ e-learning module</u>. Please complete Level 1 if you have done no prior education or Level 2 if have completed education previously.

Cycling New Zealand needs the following information before completing UCI entries:

(If you don't have all the information at the time you complete the application form, the details can be emailed to rebekah.cullinane@cyclingnewzealand.nz.)

- Copy of Passport
- Copy of your Travel Insurance and itinerary, and confirmation of Race Insurance
- TUE for medication (if needed)
- If under 18 consent form to be signed by a parent or guardian
- Your contact details while at event:
 - o Phone number and email address
 - Accommodation information (including full physical address)
- Full contact details of your "guardian" while at event (not a competing athlete)*:
 - o Their full name and relationship to you
 - o Phone number and email address
- Emergency contact details (family member etc):
 - o Their full name and relationship to you

UCI WORLD CUP INFORMATION

Event Format

6.3.006 Competition categories at a UCI BMX Racing World Cup event shall be:

- a. Men Flite
- b. Combined category of Men Under 23 and Men Junior
- c. Women Elite
- d. Combined category of Women Under 23 and Women Junior

It is recommended athletes are familiar with the <u>UCI rules</u>. Part VI: BMX Racing - BMX Racing World Cup Event rules start on page 36.

The 2024 entry fees are expected to be 250 Euro for Elite and 150 Euro for U23 and Junior combined races, for each weekend, which has two World Cup rounds.

^{*} This is compulsory for <u>ALL ATHLETES</u> – your guardian must be someone at the event or within the same city who can be responsible for you in a case of emergency while at the event.
