

Cycling New Zealand - Selection Regulations

Schedule 3C – Mountain Bike E-MTB Teams



BOARD APPROVED

1. **Objective:** Maximise the medal winning opportunities at World Championships.

2. **Mandatory Eligibility Requirements for Athletes Seeking Selection:** All athletes seeking selection to the Team must complete the Athlete Application process by providing all the information requested in the on-line Rider Application Form by the date set out in clause 5.

3. **Selection Process:**
 - 3.1. There is no obligation on the Relevant Selection Panel to fill the maximum number of positions specified by the UCI, pursuant to the UCI MTB World Championship participation rules.
 - 3.2. Participation at the Mountain Bike events, is dependent on selected athletes being able to fund themselves.

4. **Consideration to Mountain Bike Team Selection**

Riders will be selected based on the following ranked criteria:

- i. As a minimum requirement, have demonstrated performance ability by competing in a UCI sanctioned MTB event / events at Cat 1 or above, in the two (2) years prior to the Team selection date.
- ii. Selection will be based on order of application. Allocation will be filled based on the order that completed applications are received, from eligible riders, until all New Zealand quota is fulfilled.

Reserve spots will be allocated to non-selected riders in order of date of application of eligible riders.

5. **International Mountain Bike Competitions where formal Selection is needed:**

Unless Cycling New Zealand decides otherwise, Mountain Bike Teams will be selected and named at or before the specified selection date below:

6. Additional Competitions

Without limiting the Board’s power under clause 1.5 of Cycling New Zealand’s General Selection Regulations, HP Director, or designate, as applicable, may, in his/her sole discretion, decide to send Teams to compete in additional International Competitions as outlined in 5.4 of Cycling New Zealand’s General Selection Regulations.
