

2023 UCI BMX World Cup and UEC Rounds Entry Information

NOTICE: Covid-19 has had an unprecedented impact on the world and continues to evolve both internationally and in New Zealand. As such there could be further changes to the international cycling calendar which could result in changes to this document.

GENERAL INFORMATION

All riders are advised to carefully read and understand all the information below.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible to enter BMX World Cups you MUST:

- Have a current International Race Licence with the nationality marked as NZL. Your insurance (required for your International Race Licence to be processed) must cover the duration of the international events for which you are applying.

Cycling New Zealand will:

- Complete entries for UCI World Cups. **For Rounds 9 – 12 in 2023, UEC have changed their registration system and riders will now be responsible for entering themselves. Instructions for how to register yourself can be found [HERE](#).**
- Forward on any UCI / CNZ communications.
- We are waiting on confirmation of the 2023 entry fees for UCI World Cups. The 2022 fees were 250 Euro for Elite and 150 Euro for U23 and Junior combined races, for each weekend, which has two World Cup rounds.
- The 2023 fees for UEC Rounds are 65 Euro per entry, per round for the Elite Classes, and 45 Euro per entry, per round for the Junior Classes. **For Rounds 9 – 12, riders will pay these fees when registering themselves.**
- Please note there will be no specific Team Manager / Cycling New Zealand staff for New Zealand at the World Cup or UEC Round events.

Note: Any fines received by the rider are the responsibility of the rider to pay
(The UCI sends any fines through Cycling New Zealand who will on-invoice for the rider to pay).

Team tent area:

- Event organisers typically provide a general athlete tent / area (country specific spaces carry an additional cost). You have the option to hire a private team tent / area if you wish. Please contact Cycling New Zealand for details.

ANTI-DOPING

We encourage all riders competing overseas to complete education through Drug Free Sport NZ (DFSNZ). If you have not completed any DFSNZ education in the current calendar year please

complete the [DFS NZ e-learning module](#). Please complete Level 1 if you have done no prior education or Level 2 if have completed education previously.

Cycling New Zealand needs the following before completing entries for UCI and World Cup entries.

(If you don't have the information at the time you complete the application form, the details can be emailed to rebekah.cullinane@cyclingnewzealand.nz.)

- Copy of Passport
- Copy of your Travel Insurance and itinerary, and confirmation of Race Insurance
- TUE for medication (if needed)
- If under 18 consent form to be signed by a parent or guardian
- Your contact details while at event:
 - Phone number and email address
 - Accommodation information (including full physical address)
- Full contact details of "guardian" while at event (not a competing athlete)*:
 - Their full name and relationship to you
 - Phone number and email address
- Emergency contact details (family member etc):
 - Their full name and relationship to you
 - Phone number and email address

* This is compulsory for ALL ALTHLETES – who is responsible for you in a case of emergency while at the event? This must be someone at the event or within the same city.

Event Format

6.3.006 Competition categories at a UCI BMX Racing World Cup event shall be:

- a. Men Elite
- b. Combined category of Men Under 23 and Men Junior
- c. Women Elite
- d. Combined category of Women Under 23 and Women Junior
