Objectives of this symposium and process

Symposium

To provide an open forum for all of our sport to contribute to the conversation with regards to the future of the track championships make-up.

Process

To establish a sustainable future for the track championships that supports the needs of riders through the age groups and performance levels.

Summary of Survey Results

Key Findings

- 162 respondents
- Master Riders were over half of the respondents
- Waikato/BOP Centre had the highest response rate
- Gender split of respondents represents general participation demographics (70M/30W)
- 63% of respondents are currently involved in some way with the current championship competition
- Option B - Three Championships (1. U15/U17/U19/Elite/Para, 2. Masters, 3. Omnium/Madison) had the highest % of first choice overall with 42%, including the highest first choice % across all groups.
- Option A- Three Championships (1. Elite/U19/Para, 2. U15/U17/Masters, 3. Omnium/Madison) – status quo – was the second highest with 27% having this as their first choice.
- Option C - Two Championships (1. U15/U17/U19/Elite/Para/Masters, 2. Omnium/Madison) was the 3rd first choice option.
- Option E - One Championships was the fourth ranked as first choice
- Option D - One Championships (with regional qualification) was the lowest % of first choice.

Summary of Survey Results – cont'd....

Option B - Three Championships

(1. U15/U17/U19/Elite/Para, 2. Masters, 3. Omnium/Madison)

- 42% had this as their first choice (37% of Masters, 44% of U15/U17, 44% of Elite&U19, 55% of Support)
- 15% had this as their second choice (17% of Masters, 19% of 15/U17, 16% of Elite&U19, 10% of Support)
- 16% had this as their third choice (15% of Masters, 13% of U15/U17, 28% of Elite&U19, 10% of Support)
- 13% had this as their fourth choice (11% of Masters, 13% of U15/U17, 8% of Elite&U19, 16% of Support)
- 14% had this as their fifth choice (20% of Masters, 13% of U15/U17, 4% of Elite&U19, 10% of Support)

Summary of Survey Results – cont'd....

Option A- Three Championships

(1. Elite/U19/Para, 2. U15/U17/Masters, 3. Omnium/Madison)

- 27% had this as their first choice (32% of Masters, 20% of U15/17, 33% of Elite&U19, 14% of Support)
- 36% had this as their second choice (35% of Masters, 53% of U15/17, 38% of Elite&U19, 31% of Support)
- 9% had this as their third choice (7% Masters, 7% of U15/U17, 8% of Elite&U19, 17% of Support)
- 13% had this as their fourth choice (15% of Masters, 7% of U15/U17, 8% of Elite&U19, 14% of Support)
- 15% had this as their fifth choice (11% of Masters, 13% of U15/U17, 13% of Elite&U19, 24% of Support)

Summary of Survey Results – cont'd....

Importance of guiding principles order and weighting in ()

- To provide each age group with an appropriate and meaningful competition opportunity (2.92)
- To provide each age group with a platform to showcase their talent and achievements on a national stage. (3.96)
- To provide a professionally organised event that respects all members participating at any level. (3.97)
- Provide an opportunity to connect our development pathway from the very first steps of performance, through our aspirational rangitahi to our international stars on the same stage. (4.04)
- To provide opportunities to retain more riders through the age groups. (4.33)
- To create event opportunities that will showcase the sport of track cycling to the community, sports fan and will attract national media coverage. (5.07)
- To create event opportunities that supports the financial sustainability of the events through increase in participation, new sponsorship and increase spectator attendance. (5.14)
- To respect the voluntary contribution made across the sport to support the delivery. (5.42)
