



2019 UCI BMX World Cup and UEC Rounds Entry Information

LICENCES and INSURANCE

All athletes must hold a current International Race Licence to be eligible for entry to any of the 2019 World Cup races. International race licences are available upon application from Cycling New Zealand.

UCI requirements state that appropriate insurance must accompany the purchase of an International Licence. In accordance with UCI guidelines. Cycling New Zealand will not issue a rider an International Licence until proof of appropriate insurance cover has been provided.

According to UCI Cycling Regulations relating to International Licences and Insurance (1.1.022) appropriate insurance should include;

- *Insurance for bodily injury (in and out-patient hospital expenses and medical care, transport costs, permanent disablement, death) and material damages (loss of earnings) in case of accident on the occasion of a cycling competition or during training.*
- *Third-party liability insurance for material damage or bodily injury caused to others in the course of a competition or cycling event or during training.*

Cycling New Zealand endorses the International Travel Insurance product provided by Aon New Zealand and underwritten by Chubb Insurance New Zealand Limited and is satisfied it meets UCI requirements. Riders must provide a copy of their insurance certificate from Chubb before their licence will be issued.

Riders are also free to organise their own insurance coverage to accompany the purchase of an international cycling licence. Riders must provide a Cycling New Zealand with a letter or insurance certificate from their insurer stating that they hold medical cover and personal liability whilst cycle racing and training outside of New Zealand.

CYCLING NEW ZEALAND WILL:

- Complete entries with the UCI and UEC.
- For the World Cups assist with assigning a Team Co-ordinator to complete registration at the event, attend team managers meeting and forward on any UCI / CNZ communications.
- The entry fee for the World Cups is 250 Euro for each weekend of racing which has two supercross rounds. Where possible Cycling New Zealand will have pre-paid entry fees (you will then be invoiced for this), if this is not possible please have this in cash to give to the Team Co-ordinator to complete registration. This will be confirmed prior to travel to the event via group email.
- The entry fees for the UEC Rounds is 60 Euro for the Elite Classes – and 40 Euro for the Junior Classes. Where possible Cycling New Zealand will have pre-paid entry fees (you will then be invoiced for this), if this is not possible please have this in cash with you when you complete registration. This will be confirmed prior to travel to the event via group email.
- Please note there will be no specific Team Manager / CNZ HP staff for New Zealand at the World Cup at UEC Rounds events.

Note: Any fines received by the rider during the event will be the responsibility of the rider to pay (the UCI will send any fines allocated through to Cycling New Zealand who will on invoice these through to the rider to pay).

TEAM TENT AREA:

- Event organisers typically provide a general athlete tent / area (there will usually be a cost for this). You have the option to hire a private team tent / area if you wish. Please contact Cycling New Zealand for details.

UCI World Cups

PARTICIPATION

(UCI Rules 6.3.003)

UCI BMX Supercross world cup events are open to all eligible riders in possession of a UCI licence as per 6.3.006

Event Format

6.3.006 Competition categories at a UCI BMX Supercross World Cup event shall be as described in article 6.1.008 where a combined class is made by

- a. Men Elite/ Men Juniors combined class
- b. Women Elite/ Women Juniors combined class

All riders must be registered using the UCI online registration system. If you are eligible to enter following the above criteria your registration will be completed through Cycling New Zealand.

It is recommended athletes ensure they are familiar with the UCI rules
