

Cycling New Zealand - Selection Regulations

Schedule 3F – Mountain Bike E-MTB Teams



Updated 5 July 2019

1. Athlete Selection: All athletes seeking selection to the Team must complete the Athlete selection process by completing all information on the on-line Rider Application Form by 20 July 2019;

1.1. All riders participating in the event shall be responsible for all costs incurred to attend the event, including all expenses related to travel and accommodations, as well as pay the team fee including a National team kit, and support including an On-Site team manager, if applicable. Riders withdrawing after the entries close will not be reimbursed for any fees paid.

1.2. All riders are required to wear National uniform. All riders must be registered by their National federation (as per Clause 4 in https://www.uci.org/docs/default-source/official-documents/2019-uci-mountain-bike-world-championships---all/2019-uci-mtb-world-championships---e-mtb-information---march-2019.pdf?sfvrsn=9b927d49_4)

2. Consideration to the Final Mountain Bike Team Selection:

2.1. In considering riders to be selected to the Team, the selection panel may consider, when applicable, but is not limited to, the following factors drawn from Cycling New Zealand's General Selection Regulations:

2.1.1. Items mentioned in clause 2.2 (Overall Purpose)

2.1.2. Items mentioned in clause 4. (Eligibility)

2.1.3. Items mentioned in clause 8. (Factors)

2.1.4. Items mentioned in clause 10. (Extenuating Circumstances)

2.2. There is no obligation on the relevant Selection Panel to fill the maximum number of positions specified by the UCI, pursuant to the UCI World Championship participation rules.

- 3. Weighting:** Pursuant to Clause 7.2 of Cycling New Zealand's General Selection Regulations, the relevant Selection Panel, when going through the Team selection process, will select final Team based on the below mentioned priority listing.

Selection priority listing:

Due to this being the first year of sanctioned E-MTB competition and there being no official E-MTB events in New Zealand or international ranking, riders will be selected based on the following ranked criteria:

- I. Selection will be based on order of application¹. The application window will open on May 20, 2019, and close on July 20, 2019. The first 15 Women and First 15 Men to register will receive a slot. The Team Selection date is on 31 July 2019. Riders will then have until Aug. 7, 2019, to pay their team fee, complete the National Team Agreement, complete the online anti-doping education and submit their accommodation details for the World Championships². If these obligations are not completed by the deadline, slots will be forfeited and re-allocated to the next athlete in priority.

Note: Any riders beyond the first 15 to apply will be put on a waiting list and will be allocated any returned slots based on the order of application. This allocation will happen on August 1 2019 and riders will have 24 hours to confirm the use of their slot by payment of the team fee.

- 4. International Mountain Bike Competitions where formal Selection is needed:** Unless Cycling New Zealand decides otherwise, Mountain Bike Teams will be selected and named at the dates mentioned below. Teams will be selected to attend the International Mountain Bike Competitions listed in the table below:

| International Mountain Bike Competition | Competition Date | Application Date | Team Selection Date |
